At Lifeline, everything we do comes back to one thing: **transforming communities with Christ.**


We join God in His work—meeting physical needs, nurturing spiritual growth, and helping communities be restored and renewed from the inside out!

She sat quietly in class, too afraid to participate, and her confidence slipped further each day.



The Transformative Power of Baptism

In Ecuador, Claudia, Lifeline's Country Director, has been walking closely with Dennisse, guiding her in faith and encouraging her as she grew in her relationship with Jesus. Through this discipleship, Dennisse made the decision to be baptized. She said, "One day I woke up with the need to strengthen my commitment to Jesus. It was the happiest day of my life." For her, this baptism was more than a moment. It was a fresh beginning and, in her words, "a renewal of my being."

Now Dennisse is discipling others. She is leading small groups and boldly sharing the gospel, multiplying the impact of Claudia's investment in her life. This shows how discipleship transforms communities. One life renewed in Christ becomes a light for many others. An investment in ministry does more than reach one person. It builds leaders, strengthens churches, and creates ripple effects that will last for generations.



Inmates Helping Inmates

The gospel can break through any wall, even prison walls!

In Kentucky, men in a detention center packed 12,000 meals with care, knowing those meals would cross the ocean to inmates in Liberia.

With the help of a ministry partner, meals were delivered to a prison in Liberia where 120 inmates lack consistent access to food.

Breaking Cycles of Hardship

"I once thought this was impossible," Yaneth shared, reflecting on just how much her life has changed for the better since participating in Lifeline's Economic Empowerment Program.

Not long ago, she was caught in a cycle of hardship, missing out on cherished moments with her special needs daughter as she searched for work. Yet, Yaneth clung to hope, dreaming of a time when a new opportunity might arise and open the door to a better future. That dream is now her reality: with a small microloan, she launched her own clothing business and is now able to bring more stability to her family!

Today, Yaneth has a growing base of loyal customers, and when her workday ends, she can hurry home and savor more precious moments with her family.

Yaneth's story is just one among many across Latin America. Thanks to Lifeline's Economic Empowerment Program, driven entrepreneurs are gaining business knowledge and access to loans that empower them to start small businesses and provide for their families with new purpose.

"That small loan changed everything for my family," shares Yaneth, who now owns a thriving clothing business. "Now I can pay for my daughter's medical bills. I once thought this was impossible."

“Today for you, tomorrow for me”

In the remote village of El Manzano, Guatemala, 27-year-old Brenda noticed a deeply felt need in her community for better access to basic healthcare. With her own health challenges and a husband who often needed care, Brenda was aware that her mother-in-law—the only person who knew how to give essential treatments like shots—was losing her eyesight. Seeing her neighbors frequently fall ill without nearby help, Brenda was determined to step up and be the change her community so desperately needed.

For months, Brenda walked long distances each week to attend a healthcare training where she learned how to give shots and offer simple medical care. Now, Brenda not only cares for her family but also freely offers help to her neighbors. She often says, “Today for you, tomorrow for me,” a simple statement that reflects her spirit of compassion for others and desire to help lift her entire community out of hardship.

Thanks to Brenda’s determination and Lifeline Guatemala’s partnership with a local doctor. This training was brought to to eighteen additional women. Each woman completed the course and earned a certification. Equipped with medical kits and strengthened by prayer, these women are now trusted caregivers in their communities!
